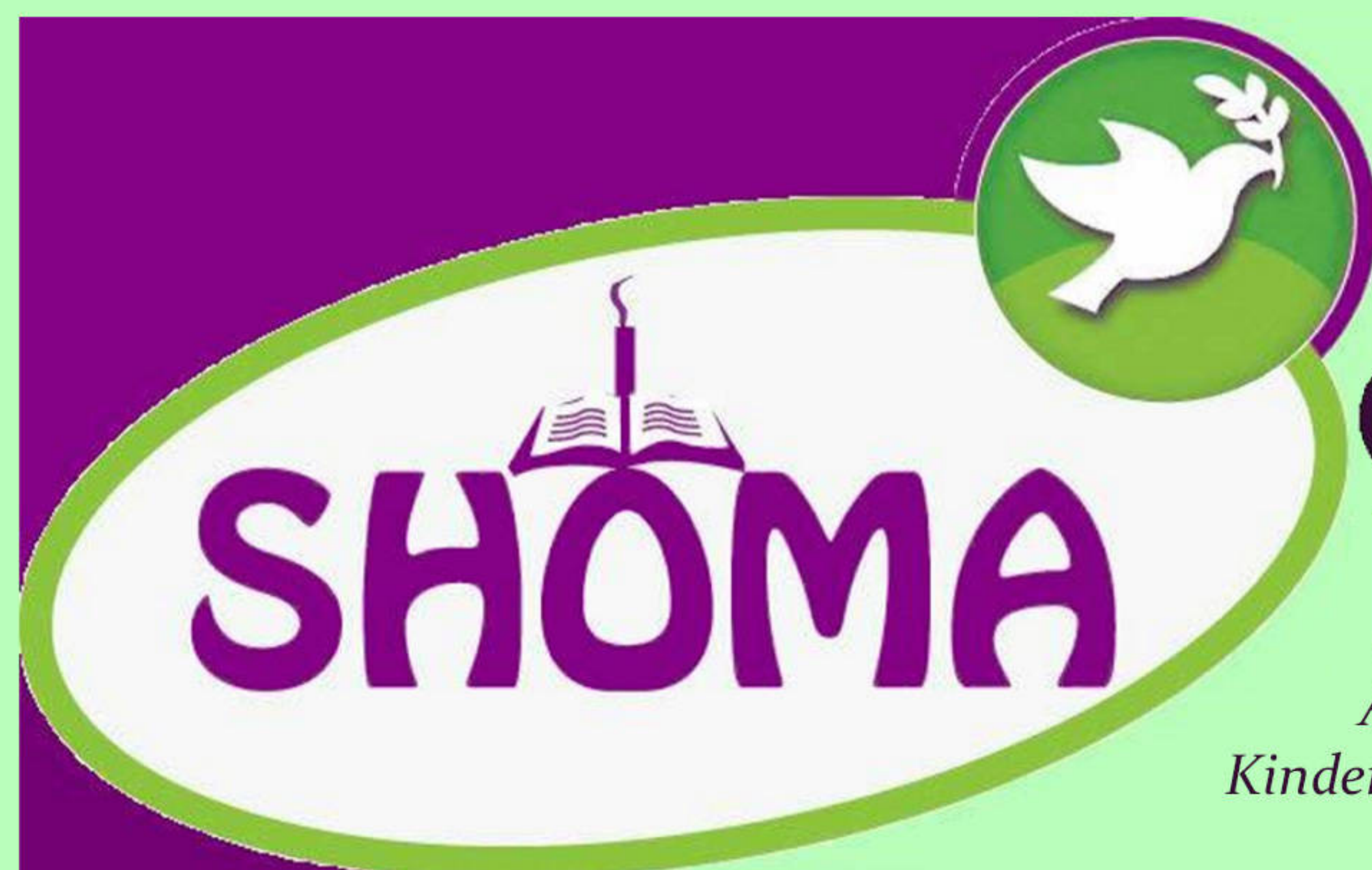
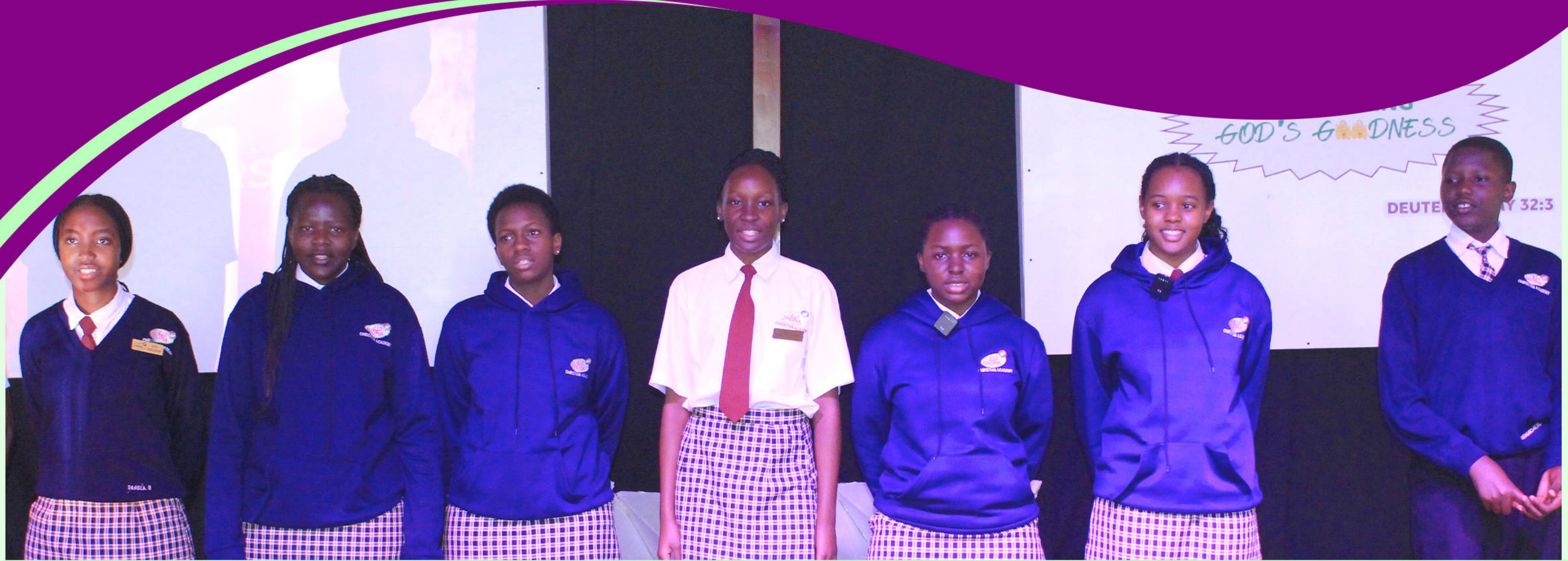

1. Introduction

We thank God for His grace and guidance throughout a successful Second Term, themed "Imitating Christ" (Ephesians 5:1), which encouraged learners to demonstrate Christ-like character through integrity, compassion, discipline, and excellence. During the term, students actively participated in academic, co-curricular, and mentorship programmes that promoted creativity, leadership, critical thinking, and holistic development. Highlights included the Shoma Production, National Mathematics Contest, Shoma Kasanje Sports Day, Friendly games in soccer & Netball with other schools both at home and away grounds, Participated in the first National cleaning Day and the successful completion of all planned school activities. 2. Growth and Development

a)Enrollment: We close this term with a total enrolment of 222 (Two Hundred Twenty-Two) Students. Of these 52 are at Kasanje Campus: 9 Kindergarten, 4 Lower Primary (P.1 - P.3), 5 Elementary (Grade 1-6) and 34 Senior (Grade 7-12). 170 Students are at Ntinda Campus. We still have vacancies for students at all levels and you are welcome to enrol with us.

b) Promotion and Graduations: We celebrate the significant achievements of our ICCE Certification and GED Exit Option students. In the last term, 9 students successfully completed their programmes, and we anticipate that 6 more will complete soon. We also commend the many students who have successfully advanced to the next level of their educational journey this term. We honor them for their diligence, perseverance, and commitment to excellence. We look forward to celebrating all these achievements as students conclude this important chapter of their academic journey.

c) Parent Fellowship/ Seminars: We successfully hosted our Parents' Fellowship and Seminar on 1st August 2026, centred on the timely theme, "*Renewed Strength in Warfare and Parenting.*" The event provided a warm, enriching, and interactive environment that fostered meaningful fellowship, insightful discussions, and shared learning. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to all parents and guardians whose presence, active participation, and valuable contributions made the seminar a resounding success.

b) EASC (East Africa Student Convention)

Our planned participation in the East African Student Convention (EASC) has been deferred to 2027 due to an insufficient number of confirmed student registrations within the stipulated timelines. While we regret the postponement, we remain enthusiastic about the opportunity ahead. Preparations and mobilization for the 2027 Convention will commence in Term Three, with a focus on early registration, adequate planning, and increased student participation to ensure a successful and rewarding experience for all involved.

4. School Fees:

Fees Payment Policy: We sincerely appreciate parents and guardians who consistently pay school fees on time. To ensure the smooth operation of the school, all families are reminded to adhere to the school fees payment policy. *Sixty percent (60%) of the school fees is to be paid at the beginning of the term, while the remaining forty percent (40%) in the 6th week.* Your continued cooperation and timely payments are greatly appreciated. *Note that: No cash will be received at school, parents are expected to use the bank or School Pay codes for their child(ren).*

Other Fees:

1. Robotics and Coding – Future Fundi Programme.

Fee: 400,000 per term. (Optional)

We are pleased to introduce the Future Fundi Programme, a hands-on, project-based Robotics and Coding initiative that equips learners with practical, real-world skills beyond the classroom. Through engaging activities, students develop critical thinking, creativity, problem-solving, and digital literacy, preparing them for the future.

2. Application / Diagnostic testing fees UGX 100,000/= for seniors, 80,000/= for Elementary students, and 60,000 for kindergarten students.

Note: GED students are expected to pay, 300,000/ for their diagnostic tests which is included on the school fees.

3. An extra charge of UGX 34,000 per PACE will apply for PACEs above the set termly goals.

4. School Requirements must be paid in cash at the beginning of the term. Kindergarten - UGX 70,000/=:, and UGX 80,000/= for Elementary and Senior students.

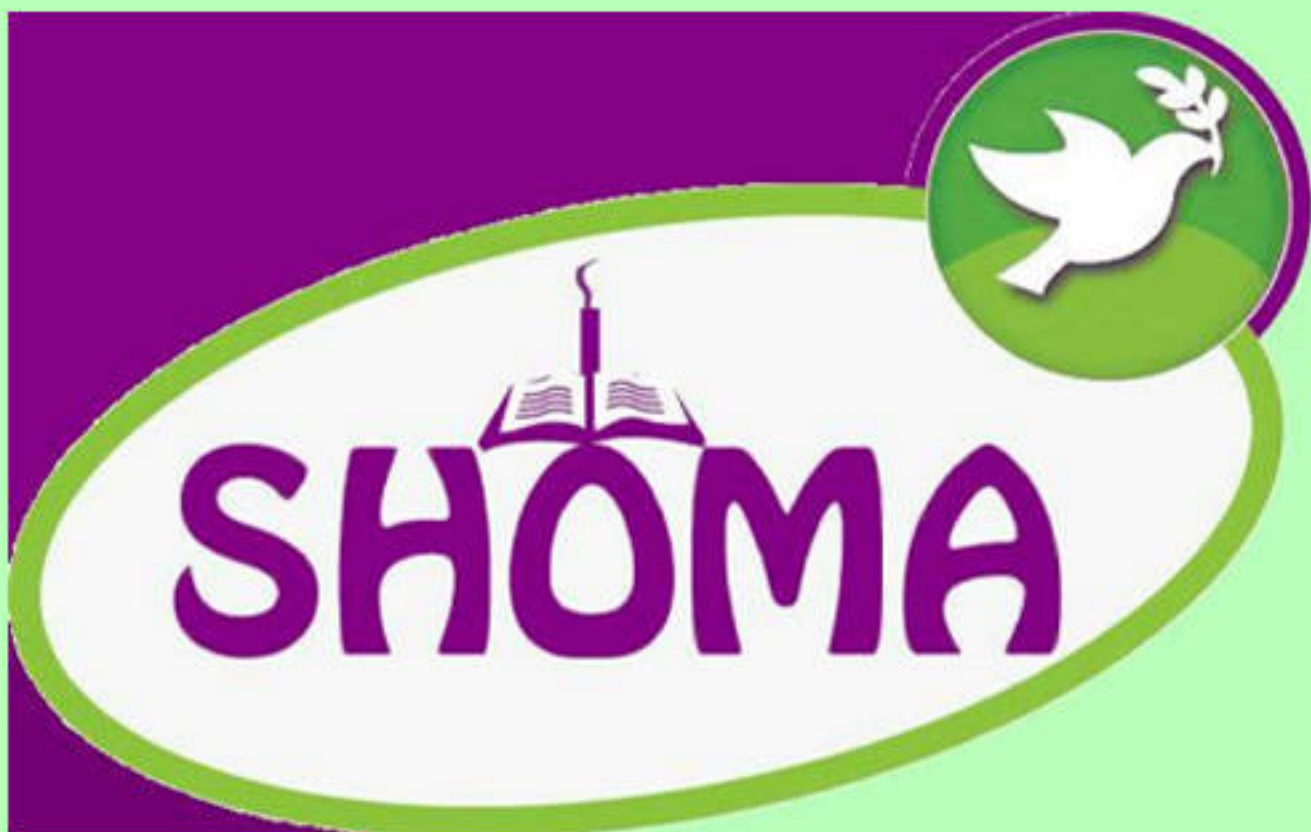
